



Endowed Chair in Gastrointestinal Malignancies

The Hollings Cancer Center and the Department of Medicine at the Medical University of South Carolina are excited to announce an opening for a clinical/translational researcher to further expand a program in gastrointestinal cancer therapy. This position will hold a \$2M endowed chair and have authority over programmatic funds currently totaling \$6M. Candidates should have an established or developing reputation in conducting clinical trials, a growing record of collaborative, peer-reviewed publications, funded research through NCI or industry and evidence of leadership ability. Candidates should be either in Medical Oncology or Gastroenterology. The Hollings Cancer Center has recently received designation by the National Cancer Institute and supports state-of-the-art clinical, research and shared resource facilities. This position will have access to extensive resources in the well-known MUSC Digestive Disease Center as well as exceptional clinical trials support infrastructure including a statewide Clinical Trials Network.
